



The Casino Regulatory Authority (CRA) is a statutory board, set up on 2 April 2008, under the Ministry of Home Affairs, to administer and enforce the Casino Control Act (Cap. 33A) ("the Act"). Our objects are: - (a) to ensure that the casinos in Singapore are free from criminal influence, (b) that gaming in the casinos will be conducted honestly, and (c) to contain the potential of the casinos to cause harm to minors, vulnerable persons and society at large.

You will be part of CRA's Legal Division, with a focus on assisting to advise on, develop and implement enforcement policies and actions. You will provide legal advice and support to CRA in all aspects of the performance of its statutory functions and duties, including:-

- Working with Senior Management to develop and implement the regulatory philosophy for CRA's enforcement regime for regulatory breaches and regulatory offences.
- Assisting to develop standard operating procedures, guidelines, and documentation templates.
- Advising on the enforcement of regulatory offences/ breaches under the Casino Control Act.
- Working closely with internal/external stakeholders and partners.
- Providing legal support to Senior Management and the Board on any disciplinary proceedings under the Act.

- Advising on the Authority's interests in any litigation by or against the Authority.
- Providing legal training to CRA officers.

Job Requirements

- Possess a good Honours degree, with at least 3 years of relevant experience.
- Have prior experience in regulatory enforcement (prior experience in public sector enforcement work would be an advantage). For private sector applicants, a litigation background would be preferred.
- Versatile, be able to think and navigate quickly in different policy and operational spheres and possesses a strong analytical mind to focus on core issues.
- Self-motivated team player with strong communications and interpersonal skills. The ability to write and reason clearly and compellingly is absolute essential.
